

Key Topics: Suffering; Worth; Unworthy

Central Idea/ Theme/ Synopsis:

Only God truly merits honor and praise but he graciously considers those who humbly serve him with wholehearted devotion to be worthy disciples.

God the Father is worthy of honor and praise

Psalm 145:3 ESV

Great is the LORD, and greatly to be praised, and his greatness is unsearchable.

II. Jesus Christ is worthy of honor and praise

Revelation 5:12 ESV

saying with a loud voice,

"Worthy is the Lamb who was slain, to receive power and wealth and wisdom and might and honor and glory and blessing!"

III. People are considered worthy by others

Lk 7:4–5 Note that the centurion did not consider himself to be worthy (Lk 7:7).

IV. God considers no person (other than Jesus Christ) to be worthy by nature

and I began to weep loudly because no one was found worthy to open the scroll or to look into it.

V. Worthiness, like righteousness, is credited to a person by God

2 Thessalonians 1:11 ESV

To this end we always pray for you, that our God may make you worthy of his calling and may fulfill every resolve for good and every work of faith by his power,

VI. Examples of people who are considered worthy by God

A. Those who put God first and deny themselves

Matthew 10:37-38 ESV

Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me. And whoever does not take his cross and follow me is not worthy of me.

B. Those who suffer persecution for the sake of Jesus Christ

Acts 5:41 ESV

Then they left the presence of the council, rejoicing that they were counted worthy to suffer dishonor for the name.

C. Those whose lives show Christlike godliness

Colossians 1:10 ESV

so as to walk in a manner worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing to him: bearing fruit in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of God;

D. Those who stand firm for the gospel

E. Those who are faithful in the use of resources which God has given them

Matthew 25:21-23 ESV

Repent - Acts 17:30 (NIV)

Confess - 1 Timothy 6:12 (NIV)

¹² Fight the good fight of the faith. Take hold of the eternal life to which you were called when you made your good confession in the presence of many witnesses.

Be Baptized - Acts 22:16 (NIV)

¹⁶ And now what are you waiting for? Get up, be baptized and wash your sins away, calling on his name.'

Remain Steadfast - Revelation 2:10 (NIV)

¹⁰ Do not be afraid of what you are about to suffer. I tell you, the devil will put some of you in prison to test you, and you will suffer persecution for ten days. Be faithful, even to the point of death, and I will give you life as your victor's crown.
